### Symbolism of the Advent Wreath Candles

#### **Fourth Sunday of Advent: 'Angels' Candle'**

The fourth and last purple candle represents peace and often called the 'Angels' candle. (Luke 2:13-14)

#### **Christmas Eve: 'Christ Candle'**

The white centre candle represents the life of Christ that has come into the world. The colour white also represents purity; Christ is the sinless, spotless, pure Saviour. (Isaiah 1:18)

Children should be confident enough to attend without a parent, although you are very welcome to take them in for the first time.
