## **'Make Yourself Heard' campaign: Silent 999 System**

The Independent Office for Police Conduct (IOPC), launched a campaign on 8th April to raise awareness of a system to help people alert police when in imminent danger but unable to speak. The 'Silent Solution' system enables a 999 mobile caller to cough or tap the handset, and then to press 55 when prompted to inform police that they are in a genuine emergency. The system is well established in the UK but is only effective if the public know and understand how it works, a silent call by itself will not automatically bring help.

## **Children's Liturgy**

A reminder that the Children's Liturgy is intended for children who are aged four and over. Generally they continue to be a part of the group for one year after their First Holy Communion, and after this they should be ready to remain with their families during the Liturgy of the Word. We use a simpler form of the readings of the Sunday, but children younger than four are not yet able to understand and contribute to the group. Children should be confident enough to attend without a parent, although you are very welcome to take them in for the first time.
