During the Week at St Anthony's

Sunday 16th June: Day for Life. *Day for Life* the day in the Church's year dedicated to raising awareness about the meaning and value of human life at every stage and in every condition. The Church teaches that life is to be nurtured from conception to natural death. The Catholic Bishops of England and Wales, Ireland and Scotland have agreed that the theme for Day for Life 2019 will tackle the reality of domestic abuse.

One in four women and about one in six men suffer from domestic abuse in their lifetime. Two women are killed every week in England by a partner or ex-partner. Bishop John Sherrington, bishop responsible for Day for Life said "These shocking statistics call us to fight against the scourge of domestic abuse. For those who are experiencing domestic abuse, the home is far from being a place of security and self-fulfilment. We want to raise awareness in churches which would be a step towards addressing this serious moral and social problem. Our aim is for anyone experiencing domestic abuse to feel able to have confidence within the Church setting."

The Secretariat of State of His Holiness Pope Francis sent the following message of support, "*His Holiness Pope Francis sends his cordial best wishes to all those celebrating the 2019 Day for Life in England and Wales, Ireland and Scotland.*"

The Retiring Collection, taken in all parishes next Sunday, will be used to help raise awareness of domestic abuse.
