At the Parish Meeting this week there was a wish to thank everyone for their generosity to the parish - there has been the anonymous donation of a keyboard and gifts of biscuits, tea and coffee recently. Volunteers have come forward to act as 'authorised person', and to help with 'safeguarding' and 'health and safety'. People have given their time on maintenance jobs in the church, and our bank balance is in a healthier position thanks to the 11 people who responded to the appeal to Gift Aid their weekly contributions to the Offertory Collection. There are now 77 families donating by Gift Aid which is a very high percentage, and for the last financial year meant a rebate of over £6,000. The church is kept very clean, there are always beautiful flowers and clean linen - all done quietly by parishioners. The people are the Church, and everyone in St Anthony's does their part in making it the special, welcoming community that it is. **Thank you!**

Frauds and Scams

We have received information from the police about **‘Drivers being targeted with fake fines’**. There is information on the noticeboard about what to do if you are approached by someone in a car park claiming to have a photo of your car speeding or illegally parked, and asking you to pay a fine on a meter. Do not pay until you have verified it with the local council.

Could it be a Scam? There is also a poster from the Citizens Advice Bureau warning of scams online, by phone, by post or in person, and giving advice on how to spot a scam.
