### **Bethlehem Art**

Today we welcome George and Elias Rishmawy, who have brought some of the olive wood carvings from their home city of Bethlehem. Every purchase will help to support the Christians living with deprivation and conflict. The Mission Statement of *Bethlehem Art* is to provide an income for the few Christian families still living in Bethlehem. There are few pilgrims or visitors to the Holy Land, so families have little opportunity to sell their work, resulting in poverty and distress. The centuries old art of carving olive wood has been passed down through generations.

### **Giving up something precious for Lent**

Time is precious, so could you give up 10 minutes a day of your precious time in Lent. There are a number of suggestions:

### **'The God Who Speaks'**

If you are reading a chapter a day you will have reached Acts, Chapter 17. St Paul's strategy when raising faith issues with non-Christians in Athens: seek common ground. We can do the same, look for issues like justice, environment, family etc. and then ask questions. The aim: what gives people meaning in life or where do they put their hope? We have a Christian worldview so should have an eternal perspective for meaning and hope rather than a fragile 'this-life-only-perspective'.
