Racial Justice Sunday - Sunday 5th February

Today is Racial Justice Sunday, the day that the Church focuses on the need to oppose racism and pursue racial justice with renewed vigour. The theme for Racial Justice Sunday is: "All are included in the mission of Christ and His Church. Let us walk together, pray together and work together"

It reflects the role each of us must play in promoting the mission of Christ and His Church. This was inspired by conversations around last year's Racial Justice Sunday and Pope Francis' visit to Canada in July 2022 when he spoke about looking towards a future of 'Justice, healing and reconciliation'.

Day of Special Prayer for Victims of human Trafficking Wednesday 8th February

St Jerome Emiliani was born in Venice, and died in 1537. After an early military career, he founded an order of priests and started three orphanages, a shelter for penitent prostitutes and a hospital. He was canonised in 1767 and in 1928 was declared Patron Saint of Orphaned and Abandoned Children by Pope Pius XI.

St Josephine Bakhati is venerated as a modern African saint and Patron Saint of Modern Sudan and of Human Trafficking Survivors. She was kidnapped at the age of nine and sold into slavery, where she experienced flogging and maltreatment, until she was bought for the Italian Consul. Here she was shown kindness and respect, but after a change in the family's circumstances she was entrusted to the care of the Canossian Sisters where she remained for 50 years. She was canonised in 2000.
