St William of York

The Feast of St William of York, Patron Saint oof York, is on Thursday 8th June. William Fitzherbert was Archbishop of York from 1141-1147, and 1153-1154. His appointment was controversial, but ended in miracles and sainthood. William was the Minster's Treasurer before becoming Archbishop, and some of the Canons disputed his appointment, so he was not officially consecrated until 1143. In 1147 he was deposed by the Pope and replaced by the Abbot of Fountains Abbey, Henry Murdac. This was unpopular with the citizens of York who refused to allow him to enter the city in 1148. William had accepted the Pope's decision and left for Sicily. However, both Abbot Murdac and the Pope died in 1153 and William was asked back to York. As he returned triumphantly to York, he stopped on the Ouse Bridge, but so many people had crowded onto the bridge that it collapsed. William stopped and prayed to God to stop the drowning, and miraculously no one was hurt. Soon afterwards, in 1154, William was taken ill after celebrating Mass, and died a week later. Many believed that there had been poison in the chalice. His stone coffin is in the Western crypt of York Minster.

The Ouse Bridge Miracle and various other miracles attributed to him after his death led to hid canonisation in 1226.
