Picture for the front of the Church Christmas Card

- Primary School age, in St Anthony's Parish
- Use PLAIN WHITE PAPER, A4 size.
- A simple picture of something from the Nativity account, which is the real meaning of Christmas. No words needed.
- Any background colouring to be light shade (so good contrast).
- Remember that the picture on the card will be reduced in size to A6 (quarter of A4 in size) so needs to be clearly visible when small.
- NO glitter or shiny bits.
- Print your name on the back & place it in box at the back of church by start of Mass on 19th November.
- Parents - please encourage your children to take part – especially something to do over half term.
- The winning entry will be announced on Sunday 26th November.
